Areas of difficulty/resistance

- The huge NIH CTSA initiative is being carried out in such a way that it takes leadership away from institutional women leaders and is guaranteed to put a heretofore unseen amount of institutional and in the aggregate national/public power in biomedical in the hands of very few men.
 - Molly Carnes has drafted a paper, "A Challenge to Academic Health Centers and the NIH to Prevent Unintended Gender Bias" with Carole Bland.
 - Jo Handelsman was invited to the NIH to discuss areas of research that are "missing" in NIH's current funding structure; she used the opportunity to discuss the problems of women, and the steps the NIH might take to alleviate them.
